#### **Services offered:**

**Mental Health:** Clients are assigned mental health case manager to help with goal-setting and action planning, including supportive counseling.

**Health / Wellness:** HIV and women's health education intended to convey information and encourage routinely check-ups. This allows them to become HIV educators to their peers in prison.

**Family:** Re-entry case managers help with immediate needs and plan for future; help with child custody issues, finding a job and housing.

#### **Eligibility information:**

- Services *are* free of charge
- Health insurance is *not* required
- Age requirement: Services available for adults age 18 and older
- There is *no* income requirement
- There is *no* living arrangement requirement
- Neighborhood served: all New York City
- Walk-ins *are* welcome
